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## 2019 CTR Surveys:

The Washington State Legislature's [Commute Trip Reduction \(CTR\) Law](#) requires employers to work with employees to reduce the number and length of drive-alone commute trips made to their worksite. Every two years, employees at CTR-affected work sites must complete a CTR survey which includes questions about how they commute.

- CTR Survey Window 1: September 16<sup>th</sup> – September 27<sup>th</sup>
- CTR Survey Window 2: September 30<sup>th</sup> – October 11<sup>th</sup>
- CTR Survey Window 3: October 14<sup>th</sup> – November 8<sup>th</sup>
- CTR Survey Window 4: November 11<sup>th</sup> – November 22<sup>nd</sup>
