RapidRide G Line Features:


- 24/7 service
- Improved reliability with buses as frequent as every six minutes
- 1.4 miles of dedicated transit lanes allowing a 16 min trip from end-to-end
- New 60-foot-long, five-door buses that can load from both curbside and center island stations
- Increased access to culture, culinary, and commercial destinations

Area Updates:

- Routes 3, 4, 10, 11, 12, 47, 49, and 60 will have service changes to connect to the new RapidRide G Line & Link light rail.
- Left turn restrictions that were implemented during Spring 2024 are now permanent to maintain safety and traffic flow. Signage is in place at all affected intersections.
- Improved lighting, pedestrian accessibility, 108 planted trees, and a new water main on Madison St. have also been added through this project.
